

People in Los Angeles were scared by rumours of immigration raids. Day labourers were worried about being arrested.



Protests in Paramount, a place with many Hispanic people, turned violent. Rocks were thrown. Police used pepper spray and rubber bullets.



The Department of Homeland Security said there were no raids at the store, but some people were arrested in other parts of Los Angeles.



President Trump sent the National Guard to help with protests. They came to keep things calm and stop violence.



People were upset. They said immigrants are important. Many know or have family without papers. They wanted to support their community.
