



Imane Khelif needs a sex test to compete in women's boxing events. This rule is for all boxers over 18.



Khelif won gold at the Paris Olympics. There was a big argument, but she competed because her passport says she is female.



World Boxing uses sex tests to keep the sport fair and safe. This helps boxers compete in the right group and stay healthy.



The test looks for Y chromosomes to decide if a boxer competes in men's or women's category.



Some think Khelif might have DSD, meaning she has both male and female traits. Other sports have rules for athletes with DSD too.



World Boxing will help boxers who get a test result they did not expect. They want to make sure all boxers are treated with respect and fairness.
