Criminals trick authorities by using ketamine's legal status in some places to sell it illegally in the UK.



Ketamine is legal in some places and illegal in others. Criminals move it between countries, making it hard for police to track.



Ketamine use in the UK is up by 85%. It is causing health problems and deaths. Criminals earn more from it than from drugs like cocaine.



Smugglers hide ketamine in parcels and vehicles to bring it to the UK. Some store it in places like AirBnBs before sending it.



Europe wants countries to work together to stop ketamine smuggling. It's important for police and governments to help with this problem.
