



A BBC team in southern Syria was stopped by Israeli soldiers with guns while filming near a UN post by the Golan Heights.



Soldiers took the team's phones and equipment, questioned them, searched them, deleted photos, and warned them not to return.



After being stuck, the team ended up in the countryside. Local children helped them find a village, and they safely reached Damascus.



The BBC told the Israeli army they were upset. The team was scared but glad they were okay. They haven't heard back yet.



The situation in the area is tense, with **Israel** and **Syria** in conflict. It's important to stay informed and aware of the risks in such regions.
