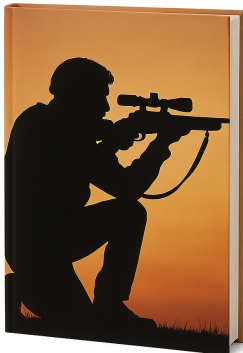




Frederick Forsyth was a UK writer, fighter pilot, journalist, and spy. His exciting books sold millions and were based on real-life experiences.
