Trump sent the National Guard to help protect agents without asking the state's governor. They won't do immigration raids. This law is rarely used.



ICE officers in Los Angeles are arresting people to send them away. This has upset some people, leading to protests.



Protests were outside shops. People tried to stop arrests. Police used tear gas. Many were arrested for not leaving when asked.



Some leaders in California think the National Guard will make things worse and believe local police can handle the protests without them.
